Entry formalities / Visa requirements - Namibia

All visitors to Namibia must be in possession of a valid passport, for at least **6 months** beyond the intended stay, as well as sufficient pages - with at least **3** free pages for endorsements.

Temporary residence permits for visitors are issued on arrival and allow tourists a period of 90 days/3 months per year in the country.

In addition to the visa, each traveller must be in possession of a valid return air ticket. Ensure that sufficient blank visa pages are available in your passport book for the entry and exit stamps.

Proof of Yellow Fever vaccinations only need to be presented by travellers coming from countries that are at risk.

Visitors are, however, advised to confirm visa requirements with their travel agent as it might change.

Nationals from the countries listed below ARE NOT required, to obtain visas to travel to Namibia on holiday for visits shorter than (90) days per annum:

Visa Exempt - Visa exempt for a stay of up to three months. The traveller must:

- Hold a passport valid at least six months on entry with two blank visa pages
- Hold proof of sufficient funds in the form of a bank statement or cash
- Hold proof of onward/return airline tickets
- Hold documents showing proof of purpose of trip
- Hold all documents required for the next destination
- Hold a visa for the next destination, if applicable
- Confirm with their airline that boarding will be permitted without a visa as these conditions are subject to change

A permit is required for travelling for the following purposes:

Media Accreditation * Study * Work * Temporary Residency * Permanent Residency

The business visa in Namibia is defined as the visa issued to people looking for prospects to set up formal business in Namibia, exploration for business opportunities, business people attending meetings at subsidiaries of their parent companies, official government visits, attending conferences, corporate events (not work) and meetings for which no remuneration is received, attending short training courses (not more than 90 days), sports events, expositions and trade fairs.

NB: All persons falling in the above category are required to pay for the business visa except those from countries that have a Visa Abolition Agreement with Namibia.

Custom Regulations - Import Regulations:

Free import by persons over 16 years of age of:

- 400 cigarettes and 50 cigars and 250g of tobacco;
- 2 litres of wine and 1 litre of spirits or liquor;
- 50 ml of perfume and 250 ml of eau de toilette;
- other gift articles up to a value of NAD 50,000.-.

All other goods than the above must be declared on arrival and will be subjected to import duties.

Export Regulations:

No restrictions. However, for export of goods such as minerals, agricultural products, wheat, meat and fish products, approval from the different ministries is required. **For further information, please find information and contacts - <http://www.mfa.gov.na/>**
